Q1. Please share with us how you benefited from entering a writing competition.

Q4. Do you have any writing tips for students looking to enter this year's competition? (1 about research, 1 about writing skills)

A3. For research, you will want to understand the topic. Typing key words would be a great start and then look at 5–10 resources. Pick out ideas and facts that were constantly repeated in those articles and note down ideas that don't appear as often. Then do some for deeper digging in those. You should be able to get a web of information that are linked to each other and decide what to write according to the information you mined up. For writing, it is all about practice and experience. Reading and exploring good writing can help you see what are forms of good writing and using what you have explored in your writing and adapt it can lead you to a door of possibilities.
